- I. The Promise of The Holy Spirit John 16
- **a.** Last week we worked through verses 1-7 however, I want to start tonight with verse 7 again.
- **b.** In verse 7, using <u>interpretation</u>, What is the important event in this verse?
- **c.** The Operation of The Holy Spirit is announced by Jesus in verses 8-11.
- d. Read Verse 8: What is meant by "when he is come"?

- e. Reprove: The word translated *reprove* means commonly to demonstrate by argument, to prove, to persuade anyone to do a thing by presenting reasons, It hence means also to *convince* of anything, and particularly to *convince* of *crime*. This is its meaning here. He will *convince* or *convict* the world of sin. That is, he will so apply the truths of God to men's own minds as to *convince* them by fair and sufficient arguments that they are sinners, and cause them to *feel* this. This is the nature of conviction always. Barnes' Notes on the New Testament. Cross with Acts 2:37-40
- f. **The world. Sinners.** The men of the world. All men are by nature sinners, and the term *the world* may be applied to them all, <u>John 1:10</u>, <u>12:31</u>, <u>1 John 5:19</u>.
