Open It

- I. Our condition alone should not produce our praise and worship but our position. 2 Corinthians 5:17-19. Now that we are in God by way of our relationship with Jesus Christ, our praise and worship should be produced by our standing.
- II. David wrote this Psalm not from a condition of comfort but from a cave after running for his life. When trouble is on your heels, your world is turned upside down, is **praise and worship** still a priority for you?
- III. What do we need to do to keep **praise and worship** in our front eyes and in our mouth?

Explore It

- I. Psalm 34:1
- a. "His praise shall continually be in my mouth".
- b. What does this mean? It does not necessarily mean that every second of every day we are actively thinking about and praising God. This would be impossible. The second part of the verse clarifies and says that his praise shall "continually" be on our mouths. It is a habit, a lifestyle. "At
