Introduction

Building on a flawed foundation in a biblical context refers to constructing one's life, faith, or ministry on shaky, temporary, or unbiblical, rather than on the solid rock of Jesus Christ and His teachings. When this foundation is faulty, spiritual, personal, or relational "storms" (trials) will cause the structure to collapse.

The church is made up of people. Therefore, when we talk about revival, we are talking to those who make-up the church.

Therefore, there can be no revival in the church until personal revival takes place in those who makeup the church.

Personal revival requires us to look deep within and address what may be happening inside of us that need to be revive.

There can be no revival at the church until the church engages in personal revival. Otherwise, that which we build will be built on a flawed foundation.

The Lesson

I. Key Components for Personal Revival

a. Constant Word Exposure: Regularly immersing oneself in Scripture to allow it to shape and renew the mind.

II. Active Repentance & Cleansing:

a. Confessing sin to remove barriers.

1 Jon 1:9. It appears that true revival can be hindered because of the lack of repentance.
